Opening of Registration and Abstract Submission

Dear Colleagues,

The International Nuclear Physics Conference 2010 (INPC2010) will be held July 4-9, 2010 in Vancouver, Canada, on the campus of the University of British Columbia (UBC). The conference will be hosted by TRIUMF, Canada's national laboratory for particle and nuclear physics.

The conference will consist of plenary talks and parallel and poster sessions. INPC2010 will speak to all key questions in Nuclear Physics and showcase recent highlights and advances. The conference includes a non-technical session on Sunday afternoon to which the general public will be broadly invited, and a welcome reception Sunday evening. The conference will convene on Monday morning with plenary talk and completes on Friday after the morning session.

The plenary program has been arranged with the help of the International Advisory Committee. I am very excited about the speakers that are coming and the topics covered.

It is with great pleasure that we invite you to participate and contribute to this meeting. At this point general registration is open and we welcome your abstract submissions. Please take a look at the webpage <a href="http://INPC2010.triumf.ca">http://INPC2010.triumf.ca</a>.

In order to showcase graduate students at the conference, a student poster session with prizes for best posters has been arranged. There will be lunch seminars for graduate students and we are happy to announce a graduate student support program for a limited number of students. The INPC2010 is sponsored by the International Union for Pure and Applied Physics (IUPAP) through the C12 Commission for Nuclear Physics. To secure IUPAP sponsorship, the organizers have provided assurance that INPC2010 will be conducted in accordance with IUPAP principles as stated in the IUPAP resolution passed by the General Assembly in 2008. In particular, no bona fide scientist will be excluded from participation on the grounds of national origin, nationality, or political considerations unrelated to science.
