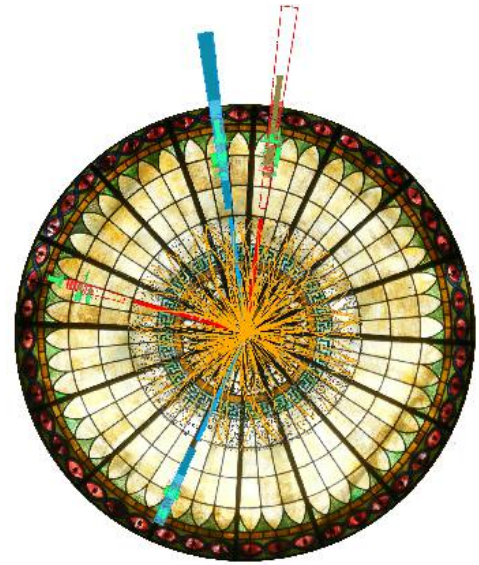

DEADLINES:

- 1 March: Abstract Submission Deadline
- 15 March: Early Registration Fee Deadline
- 15 March: Shared Hotel Room Registration Deadline

REGISTRATION:

We are sensitive to the tight economic situation, and we are working to make this meeting affordable, especially for students. The registration fee for the conference is \$400 regular, \$200 student; this is substantially lower than past years. (Consequently we must be frugal with any requests for discounts.) Additionally, we can organize hotel roommates with another DIS participant to minimize expenses (see below). We hope this will maximize participation by students and young physicists.

HOTEL INFORMATION:

The suggested conference hotel is the **Holiday Inn Dallas Central—Park Cities**. The hotel is walking/shuttle distance to the workshop venue, so rental cars are not useful or recommended. The conference rate is \$95/night+tax, and includes breakfast and Wi-Fi. The rooms are spacious, and the price is the same for a single (one bed) or double (two beds).

SHARED ROOM OPTION: To economize, we can organize shared rooms with DIS participants; this rate is \$50/night per person.¹ See the TRAVEL section of the DIS webpage for details and registration.

VISA INFORMATION:

For those who need a visa, please allow adequate time for processing. If you need an invitation letter, please submit your request **now** via the DIS2015 website noted above.

TRAVEL INFORMATION:

Dallas is served by two major airports. **Dallas-Fort Worth (DFW)** is the large international airport. **Dallas Love Field (DAL)** is the smaller airport. SMU is easily accessible from both these airports by bus, train, and taxi. *Note that **Southwest Airlines** now flies direct from Dallas to many major US cities at reasonable fares².*

¹ This is the total nightly price and includes all fees and taxes; breakfasts and Wi-Fi are included.

² For example, fares from Dallas to Chicago, New York, Washington DC, Atlanta, Philadelphia, and Boston are approximately \$100 each way—including luggage.
