Conference Venue

All abstracts and talks must be in English.

Conference Proceedings

The refereed proceedings will be published primarily on-line, with details to be provided later.

Registration and Accommodation

The on-line registration will open on 21st March with the fee set at AUD\$ equivalent of 600 Euros. This will include a conference bag and program, access to all sessions and the Welcome Reception on Sunday afternoon ($\sim 4.30 \text{ pm} - 6.00 \text{ pm}$), catering for poster sessions, all tea and coffee breaks and lunches and an excursion on the Wednesday afternoon.

This fee will increase for late registrations after 26th April, 2016.

The preferred method of payment is by credit card.

The website will also have links to recommended hotels. You are strongly encouraged to use the links provided to make your accommodation booking.

There will be an accompanying person fee of AUD\$100, which will include the Welcome Reception and the excursion, which includes a packed lunch.

Student Registration

We expect to provide support by waving the full registration cost for at least 50 students. In order to have the fee waived students must write to inpc2016@adelaide.edu.au with name, nationality, institution, supervisor details and academic program together with a letter from their supervisor. The Organising Committee will allocate a unique code to be used on the Registration form which will enable the fee waiver.

A reduced fee of the AUD\$ equivalent of 475 Euros will apply to any student for whom a waiver is not possible (once funds are exhausted).

Abstract Submission Information

We encourage the submission of oral and poster contributions in the indicated scientific areas. Every endeavour will be made to offer an oral or poster presentation for all abstracts submitted by a registered participant.

Call for Abstracts

On-line submission of abstracts opens on 21 March 2016 and is available until 29 April 2016 through the on-line abstract submission. The submitting author will be notified by 10 June 2016, if the abstract has been selected for an Oral or Poster presentation. Abstracts will not be considered for presentation unless the presenting author has registered.

Abstract Preparation

Upload maximum of 1 A4 page in 12pt Times New Roman font in PDF format only. Presenting author to be listed first. The abstract must be written in English.

Abstracts can only be submitted on-line through the on-line abstract submission form in PDF format. Abstracts that are emailed or faxed will not be accepted.

Social Program and Conference Dinner

There will be a Welcome Reception on Sunday 11th September from 4.30 pm to 6.00 pm in the Convention Centre (near the Registration Desk).

There will be two Poster Sessions held during the Conference with light refreshments.

In addition there will be a choice of excursions on Wednesday afternoon (14th September) and (at a small cost to delegates) the Conference Dinner will be held at the Adelaide Oval on Thursday evening (15th September).

Letters of invitation and Visa requirements

For many countries (\sim 65) visas may be obtained almost instantly on-line or through your travel agent. Please check with your travel agent ASAP.

Where a visa is required the Conference web page will have full details on how to obtain a letter of invitation. It will have a list of information that we can forward to authorities to ease the application process for delegates. You are urged to apply for a visa at least 3 - 4 months ahead of the Conference. Although in most cases (where an electronic visa or visa waiver is not available) it should take less than 2 - 3 months to obtain a visa.

Travel

Adelaide airport has many flights per day with direct international connections on Qantas, Emirates, Singapore Airlines, Cathay Pacific. The airport is a 10 minute drive from the city and all recommended hotels. Taxis should cost approximately AUD\$25 (payment by either cash or credit card). There is also a regular bus service to the City and major Adelaide hotels. Tips are not expected in taxis and restaurants in Australia.
