



Visiting Instructor in Physics University of Richmond

The Department of Physics at the University of Richmond invites applications for a full-time visiting instructor position in Physics to begin August 2020. This is a non-tenure track appointment, annually renewable for up to two years after the initial year, contingent upon performance, budget, and continued need. Applicants must have at least a Master's degree; a Ph.D. in physics or a related field is preferred. The instructor will teach two sections per semester (12 contact hours per week or the equivalent of 8 units per year) of introductory physics courses for both science and non-science majors, in an active-learning workshop format.

The University of Richmond is a private university located just a short drive from downtown Richmond, Virginia. Through its five schools and wide array of campus programming, the University combines the best qualities of a small liberal arts college and a large university. With nearly 4,000 students, an 8:1 student-faculty ratio, and more than 90% of traditional undergraduate students living on campus, the University is remarkably student-centered, focused on preparing students "to live lives of purpose, thoughtful inquiry, and responsible leadership in a global and pluralistic society."
