I can't open an Office document after I install Office 2008 SP2 Update

Cause: This is a known issue with Office 2008 SP2 Update.

▼ Solution: Save your Excel workbook by using an earlier version of Office 2008 for Mac.

Open and save the affected Excel workbook from a computer that has one of the following updates installed: Office 2008 for Mac 12.1.3 Update, Office 2008 for Mac 12.1.4 Update, Office 2008 for Mac 12.1.5 Update; Office 2008 for Mac 12.1.6 Update; Office 2008 for Mac 12.1.7 Update or Office 2008 for Mac 12.1.9 Update.

▼ Solution: Save your PowerPoint presentation, such as .pptx, .pptm, or .potx, by using 2007 Microsoft Office Suite Service Pack 2 (SP2) for Windows.

Open and save the affected PowerPoint presentation, such as .pptx, .pptm, or .potx, from a computer that has 2007 Microsoft Office Suite Service Pack 2 (SP2) for Windows installed.

▼ Solution: Save Excel workbooks to the .xlsb format in Excel 2007.

Open and save the affected Excel workbook to the Excel Binary Workbook (*.xlsb) format from a computer that has Excel 2007 installed.

▼ Solution: Save your document to .doc, .xls, or .ppt format by using Office 2008 for Mac 12.1.9 Update or an earlier version.

- 1. In the Finder, select /Applications/Microsoft Office 2008, and then on the File menu, click Move to Trash.
- 2. Select /Users/user_name/Library/Preferences/Microsoft/Office 2008/Microsoft Office 2008 settings.plist, and then on the File menu, click Move to Trash.
- 3. On the Finder menu, click Empty Trash.
